## Looking At HOLLYWOOD

HOLLYWOOD, Oct. 9—(NEA)—Bringing movies to the screen usually is pretty cut-and-dried stuff.

Hollywood buys a hit play or a best-selling novel with a six-figure check. A screen writer knocks out an original story. It's all business—cold and calculated to keep the cash-register keys and theatre ushers jangling.

The story behind RKO's new movie "Sister Kenny" is different. It has a heart, and hard work and elation and despondency are behind it.

For three years Rosalind Russell tried to sell Hollywood on the idea of filming a story about Sister Kenny and her polio treatment. For three years Hollywood laughed at her.

Roz Made Herself A Pest

"I guess," she told us, "I got to be a pest. I hounded L. B. Mayer and pestered Darryl Zanuck and annoyed Jack Warner. I told the story of my idea over and over again, until they were sick and tired of seeing me in their offices. They kept telling me: 'Roz, it just can't be done. It isn't box-office. It isn't entertainment!'"

Roz first became interested in the problems of crippled children when she was herself a child in Waterbury, Conn. As the years passed, her interest in the relief

of the physically handicapped remained high. But, except for contributing her time and money to various organizations, she found little concrete work she could do.

Then she read a story in a magazine. It was about the difficulties facing Sister Kenny in her efforts to introduce her treatment for infantile paralysis to the medical profession.

"I felt," Roz said, "that here was my chance to really do something to help."

She financed filming of a short picture showing the Kenny polio treatment, which was shown to doctors and hospital heads throughout the world. She traveled with Sister Kenny. And she began her campaign for a feature-length picture.

Roz almost gave up the battle
