## Independent Red Wisconsin State Journet 18 to Stay on Ballot

Governor Candidate Not Affected by Law

Although a Milwaukee circuit udge this week upheld a Milwaukee election commission verdiet barring a Communist assembly candidate from the No-vember ballot, the name of the "independent Communist" candidate for governor will remain on the ballot, it appeared today. A state law bars the Communist party

Eisenscher, a Milwaukeean, is running in the independent column under the "Independent Communist" designation.

Roberts said that the law barring the party from the ballot does not affect individual candidates who run as independents.
