# CHANGE HINGES ON PLANT COSTS

Delphos Meter Rental To Remain Same

(Lima News Bureau)

DELPHOS, Oct. 10—Change in the collection of water meter rentals here will not be made until the revision of the present waterworks is completed, according to a statement made today by Service Director Sylvester Baumgart.

The change will be completed next year.

Director Baumgart said such measures would be considered after operation of the plant is put in effect so the cost of operation can be determined.

Bids on a pump station, including a building, afloat and other facilities still must be obtained in the program outlined by Engineer Carl Simons, Van Wert.

A contract for installation of two pumps for use in furnishing the present stand pipe was awarded the Berley Co., Lafayette. When this installation is made, electrification of the present waterworks will be made with possibility that employees at the plant will be decreased. Three

regular and an extra engineer are hired by the city for operation of the steam system at present.

A contract for construction of five pump houses over the new wells was awarded to the Mertz Co. Work on the projects will be carried out immediately with exception of a retaining tank at the new field which will be started next spring, officials said.





