Rebels Battle For Tehran Pass

TEHRAN, Oct. 11 — (UP) — Rebellious tribesmen mounted heavy attacks against government positions in Fars province again today, but were repulsed after suffering heavy casualties.

A government announcement said one officer and two enlisted men were killed by the rebels during a skirmish for control of a strategic pass between Lar and Jahrum, in the Southern Persian gulf area. The tribesmen were dispersed by a government column which arrived later, according to the announcement.

The government military broadcasting station said that communications had been re-established between Shiraz, capital of Fars province, Jahrum, and Ardakan.

CHINA IS PLACED ON WAR FOOTING

Order Hints Kai-Shek Has Abandoned Peace Hopes

NANKING, Oct. 11 — (UP) — Nationalist China was placed on an official war footing today by a government mandate affecting some 300,000,000 people which restored military control over all Nationalist civilian administrations.

All males between the ages of 18 and 45 were made eligible for military conscription under the mandate. Some observers interpreted the order as a virtual abandonment of peace hopes by Chiang Kai-Shek's Kuomintang government.

Nationalist troops under Gen. Fu Tso-Yi were reported within eight miles of the Communist bastion of Kalgan in Chahar province and closing in on the city from the north and south.

The northern striking force of Fu's pincer attack reportedly had reached Wangchuan, eight miles northwest of Kalgan, having pushed forward 10 miles since yesterday's capture of Changpei.

Other Nationalist units, supported by aircraft and artillery, were reported 25 miles south of Kalgan, in the vicinity of Sinsuwan.

Chiang was re-elected president of the Kuomintang executive committee today. He will serve until a new chief executive is elected after the inauguration of a constitutional government.
