STRIKE OFFERS FAMINE THREAT TO PHILIPPINES

MANILA, Oct. 15.—(JNS)—A Philippine government spokesman declared today that the Philippine islands face a probable famine unless the American shipping strike ends and food shipments are resumed.

Arthur Tanco, manager of the national rice and corn commission, said that 400,000 tons of rice were allocated to the Philippines for the last half of 1946 by the international food council but that no shipments have been received since the start of the strike.
