Will OPA Be Back? OPA failed to keep prices down on controlled items. OPA also failed to provide a plentiful supply of foodstuffs and other commodities as it promised to do under price control. Black markets thrived under the scarcity. Congressman Henry envisioned this situation when he voted against OPA. He was convinced that only unrestricted production, together with unrestricted competition in free and open trade, will lead to plenty and to reasonable prices. But the OPA law is still in effect, ready for manipulation by a befuddled bureaucracy. The surest way to permanent decontrol is to control the New Deal for the next two years with a REPUBLICAN CONGRESS.
