## AREA COUNTIES READY FOR BIG VOTE TUESDAY

Total of 76 Special Issues Listed for District in Off-Year Balloting

What may develop into a record off-year total of voters will go to the polls Tuesday in the six counties surrounding Allen-co.

In addition to casting their ballots on the races for U. S. senator, district congressmen, state senators and representatives, a scattered number of county officers, these voters will be asked to decide 76 special issues.

Campaigning, with the exception of last-minute efforts on the part of individual candidates had been completed Saturday. Party leaders and candidates alike agreed little can be done to change the outcome of the balloting between now and Tuesday.

(Lima News Bureau) OTTAWA, Nov. 2—Between 10,000 and 12,000 voters are expected to cast ballots in Tuesday's off-year election in Putnam-co, experts predicted Saturday.

In addition to the state-wide and district-wide contests, voters in this county will decide the following county races: State representative—Charles H. Veach (R) and J. Harry Leopold (D); auditor—Ellsworth J. Conn (R) and Grover C. Nichols (D); county commissioner—R. B. Troyer (R) and John Bogel (D).

Also, 10 special issues will be decided Tuesday. Three bond issues are included in the list, \$100,000 for a new sewer system in Ottawa, \$150,000 for a new Miller City-New Cleveland school building and \$112,000 for a new Glendon school building. One local option and six levies make up the other issues.

The special issues include a \$500,000 bond issue for a hospital in four western townships; a \$30,000 bond issue for a swim-

ming pool in St. Marys; a \$25,000 bond issue for a veterans' memorial in Minster; a \$10,000 bond issue for a veterans' memorial in Jackson; a \$7,000 bond issue for purchasing fire equipment in Caledonia; a referendum on installation of parking meters in parts of Wapakoneta, and 11 tax levies.
