Refugees Shout Abuse on British

FAMAGUSTA, Cyprus, Nov. 4-(INS) - Jewish refugee women spat at British troops and shouted abuse today when 1,279 illegal immigrants transferred from Haifa were put ashore for detention on Cyprus Island.

Jewish women carrying a stretcher case at first refused to hand it over to the soldiers. Large numbers of immigrants showed signs of having been subjected to tear gas-either in their previous fight with the Spanish crew aboard the intercepted blockade runner San Dimitrio, or with the British at Haifa.

Several temporarily blinded had to be led ashore in the transfer from the British transports Empire Heywood and Ocean Vigor.


