

Genuine Mystery Film Due To Start at Quinla Friday

The genuine mystery film, after a long and somewhat mediocre career, at last has come into its own as today's fair-haired lad of the cinema. This is proved adequately in the Quinla's new film scheduled for opening Friday entitled "The Walls Came Tumbling Down," starring Marguerite Chapman and Lee Bowman.

Adapted from Joe Eslinger's famous best-seller, the yarn pivots about the grim hunt for a pair of missing Bibles. Encoded in the pages of the volumes is information leading to the whereabouts of a rare and priceless work of art hidden for over 25 years. Few men know of the actual existence of this treasure, encircling the film with deep mystery and suspense.

Teaming dynamic John Garfield with a hard-hitting, fast-moving script that offers the star plenty of tough competition from a group of unscrupulous petty racketeers and, in equal dosage, plenty of romantic situations with a lovely lady, is an infallible formula for sure fire screen entertainment. This, and much more is to be found at the Ohio in "Nobody Lives Forever" with John Garfield and Geraldine Fitzgerald.

"Our Hearts Were Growing Up" with Diana Lynn, Gail Russell and Brian Donley. The film, which has been booked here several times previously, then withdrawn because popular demand necessitated the holding over of another picture, tells the story of two sweet young things who attempt to make a go of careers in New York. They start out with a bang when upon arrival they find their luggage has been switched and in its place are bags of liquor and liquors—especially bad as the film setting is in prohibition.

"Make Mine Music" will open Thursday at the State. The newest of Walt Disney's animated films is outstanding because in it has been incorporated things suitable and entertaining not only for adults but for children as well. Now playing at the theatre is "Two Guys from Milwaukee" with Dennis Morgan and Jack Carson with "The Dark Horse" as the co-feature.

Opening at the Lyric Thursday will be "Cherokee Flash" and "South of Monterey," both true western films which will get the approval of fans of such films.

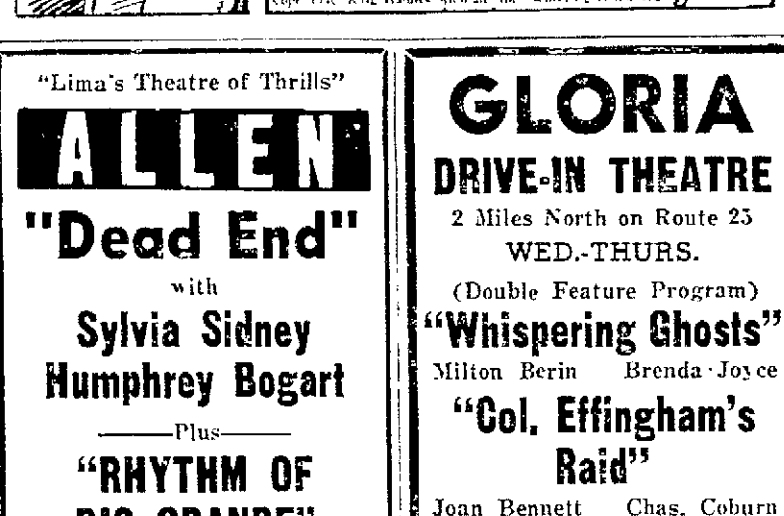
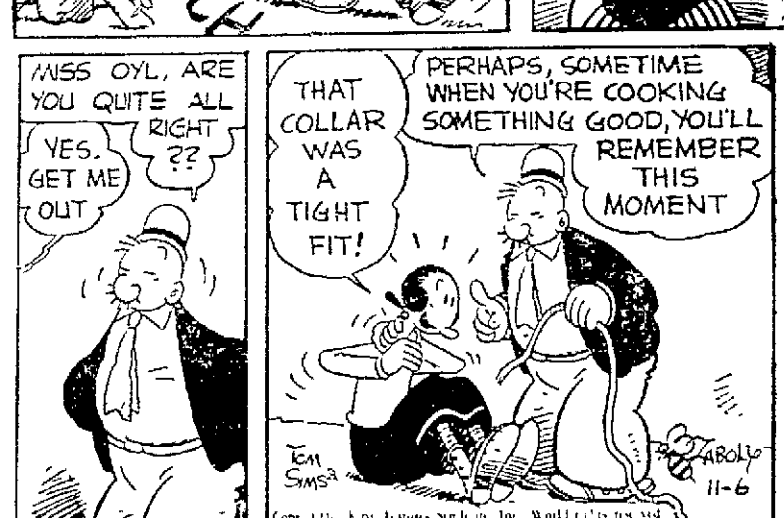
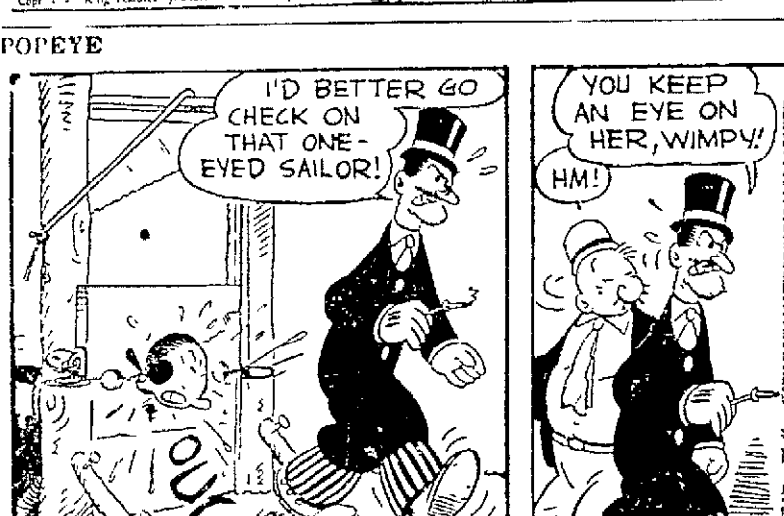

YUBA CITY, Calif., Nov. 6—(AP)—Billy Anderson, 16, and Nathaniel James, 15, convicted last week of slaying of the former's father and stepmother, Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Anderson, have been sentenced to life imprisonment in San Quentin prison.

The Andersons were shot to death Sept. 8 at their Live Oak ranch home as they were preparing for bed.

Under California law the youths must serve at least seven years before they will be eligible to apply for parole.
