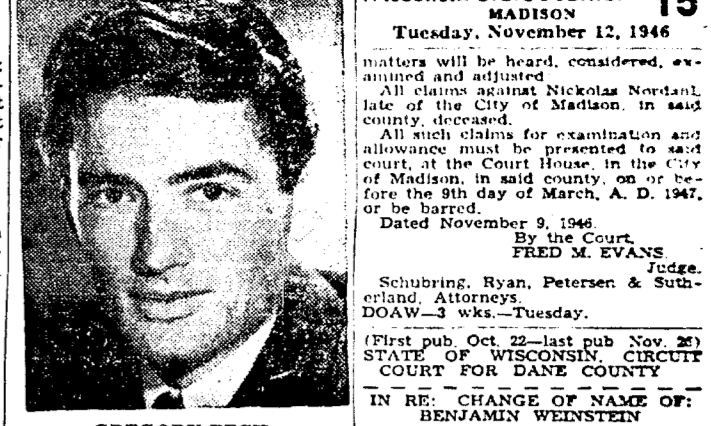

U.S. Health Service
to Send Out Experts
Investment Companies
in Drive on Cancer

CLEVELAND, O. (U.P.) — The United States Public Health Service soon will have eight or more cancer experts working in the field of the government's concentrated program to control the disease.

These experts will be part of a cancer control section now being set up by the health service, Austin V. Deibert, chief of the program, said. They will work with state health authorities.

Deibert collaborated with Dr. Leonard A. Scheele, assistant chief of the National Cancer Institute, in preparing a paper read at a meeting of the Public Health Cancer Assn., held in advance of the 71st annual session of the American Public Health Assn., which opens Friday.

Dr. Edmund G. Zimmerman, director of the division of cancer control, Iowa state department of health, stressed the importance of education in the fight against cancer. He said this education should not be limited to the physician, but also should include all practitioners, dentists, nurses, and social workers and others who have the occasion or opportunity to advise

in health matters or in early cases of cancer.
