Mother Asks Police Search for Alma McKinnon

A two-state search was in progress Wednesday in an attempt to locate Alma McKinnon, 17, reported missing from her home at 230 Nye-st since Sunday afternoon. The girl's mother, Mrs. Marjorie McKinnon, told police her daughter may have gone to Kentucky to be married.

Alma, who was described as 5 feet, 7 inches tall, brown hair and eyes, weight 130 pounds, was reported wearing a peach-colored two-piece suit, black blouse, brown shoes, white anklets and a navy blue pea coat at the time of her disappearance. Authorities of southern Ohio and Kentucky were asked by local police to be on the lookout for the girl and a possible companion.
