Bohemian Mine Blast Kills 52

PRAGUE, Nov. 15 — (UP) — Fifty-two miners were killed today in an explosion of unexplained origin in the Brown coal mine at Lom in Northwest Bohemia, the ministry of industry announced.

The victims included 37 Czechs, seven accused Czech collaborators, seven German war prisoners and one free German miner, according to the announcement.

All miners in the main corridor were killed.

Rescue squads opened the corridor during the morning and immediately began bringing out the bodies.
