## FORD WALKOUT THREAT PASSES

### Agreement Reached in Dispute Over Health Hazards

DETROIT, Nov. 16 (UP)—The threat of the first major strike at the Ford Motor Co., since the end of the war was averted today when the CIO Auto Workers announced that agreement had been reached with Ford on a prolonged dispute over health hazards.

of the huge River Rouge plant brought the first disciplinary action under the company's contract with the CIO auto workers.

Thirteen crane operators walked out, insisting that company use of sodium fluoride in steel making endangered their health. Local 600, representing the 65,000 workers at Rouge, promptly demanded that the company withdraw the disciplinary action and negotiate on the health hazards dispute.

On Oct. 29, Local 600 filed a 30-day strike notice. Negotiations began immediately on the two issues.

Tommy Thompson, president of Local 600, said the agreement provides that disputes arising out of health hazards now are a subject of collective bargaining and that the issue which precipitated the strike notice will be submitted to

Dr. Harry Shulman, the umpire under the contract.

Thompson said that the agreement would be submitted to a mass meeting of Local 600 tomorrow with recommendation that it be accepted. Approval of the workers, which is expected, will be followed by withdrawal of the strike notice.

## OPA Closings Return \$43,707

CINCINNATI, Nov. 16 (AP)—The immediate shutdown of 1,642 OPA price boards throughout the nation will make available a large quantity of surplus property urgently needed by educational institutions to accommodate overflow student enrollment, the War Assets Administration regional office reported today.

The WAA said the federal work agency had agreed to take over all surplus property in OPA offices for distribution to these institutions at five per cent of the appraised value.

The date for removal of the property from the boards has been set for Dec. 12.
