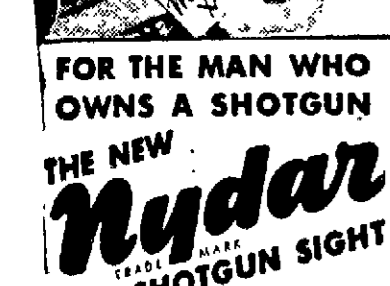

## Delphos Groups To Determine Uses for Additional City Funds

DELPHOS, Nov. 27—Decision on the manner in which additional city funds to be derived from a three-mill levy approved by voters Nov. 5 are to be used is expected to be made when various civic leaders meet in city council chambers Dec. 5.

This was announced Tuesday night during the weekly council meeting. Arrangements were made for the finance committee of council, the city planning board and the Delphos Civic club to hold the Dec. 5 meeting.

Council adopted a resolution accepting the three mills together with the continuation of a present two mill levy on the city tax rate.

A lengthy discussion was held on the matter of councilmen attempting to handle complaints on parking and street repairing. The legislators were informed by City Solicitor Clarence Marsh that such matters should be referred to the service director.

The matter came up when Secretary Fied Kietzfeld of the Chamber of Commerce placed before council a request of the Chamber of Commerce and the Civic club for better parking facilities in Delphos.

Proposals have been made to council that parking meters be installed in the business district; that one-hour parking be established between Second and Fourth-st on Main-st between 8 a. m. and 6 p. m. on week days and until 9 p. m. on Saturdays, and that 10-minute parking zones be set up at the postoffice and local banks.

City Clerk Arthur Wulforth was instructed to invite the superintendent of the Pennsylvania railroad to come here soon to discuss complaints regarding the newly-installed flasher warning signals at crossings of the line.

## FIVE DIVORCES ARE DISMISSED; 2 GIVEN DECREE

Journal Entries Filed on Cases; \$35,000 Action Also Withdrawn

Two divorce decrees have been granted, five other divorce actions dismissed and a money suit dismissed by journal entries in Allen-co common pleas court.

Decrees were granted in the cases of Edith U. Myers vs. Kent Myers and William Leonard Stevenson vs. Marianne Stevenson. In the latter case the court approved a separation agreement, awarded custody of their child to the defendant and ordered the plaintiff to pay \$30 monthly for support of the child.

Dismissed divorce actions include those of Caro E. Beraw vs. Ambrose E. Beraw, Velma D. Long vs. Thomas N. Long, Glesna D. Cappella vs. Joseph A. Cappella, Mary M. Schindler vs. Ralph Schindler, and Connie M. Lopez, by Susie Foelt, vs. Arthur Frank Lopez.

The money action dismissed was the case of Frank Osting, administrator of the estate of Mary Philomena Osting, against Pennsylvania railroad. The suit, asking \$35,000, was based on a fatal grade crossing accident at the Jefferson-st crossing in Delphos April 18, 1946, in which the deceased was fatally injured while riding in an auto operated by Francis Schatzinger.

Another entry dismissed Baird Hunt and The American Alliance Insurance Co. as plaintiffs in the case of Baird Hunt, The American Alliance Insurance Co. and the Bates Motor Transport Lines vs. Morris L. Burk, administrator of the estate of R. H. Campbell, Forest. This action was based on a traffic accident May 5, 1944, on U. S. Route 30-S and judgment for \$13,150 was asked in the original petition.

Elmer H. Halker, against whom two judgments totaling \$4,616.90 plus interest were returned in favor of Byron H. Dershem as administrator of the estate of Oliver P. Dershem was ordered by the court to show cause by Jan. 18 why the judgments against him should not be revived.

A \$616.90 judgment was granted May 7, 1937, and a \$4,000 judgment Oct. 30, 1937. Both accidents were based on a traffic accident Mar.
