650 Unharmed In Temple Fire

CLEVELAND, Dec. 2.—(INS)—Six hundred and fifty worshippers, including 350 children, were driven from services when fire broke out in the Temple of the Heights in suburban Cleveland Heights.

The only injury reported was

that to a fireman, Walter Miller, who was struck on the shoulder by falling bricks.

Firemen brought the blaze under control within an hour and an early estimate of damages to the temple and the adjoining Spira Hall was revised downward to \$25,000.

Cleveland Heights Assistant Fire Chief Frank Veasley said that the fire broke out from a short circuit behind the stage in Spira Hall.
