

PRESENT TAX PROGRAM GETS LEAGUE BOOST

Lima Officials Supported in Suggestion on Retaining Sharing Plan

Thru efforts of two Lima officials the League of Ohio Municipalities Friday went on record as favoring a continuation of the present distribution of state sales tax receipts during the league's annual meeting in Columbus.

With many of the larger cities in Ohio favoring return to the old system of distribution according to needs, Mayor W. L. Ferguson said Auditor George A. Burgeon said Saturday they spoke for a distribution method similar to that in effect the last two months of this year which was based on local tax receipts from real estate and personal property.

The league approved the proposal by a 34-23 vote, Burgeon said, and at the same time went on record as favoring a 75-25 division of sales tax monies with local subdivisions sharing in the 75 per cent and the state retaining the other four per cent.

The league also will recommend to the next session of the state legislature that 45 million dollars be allocated to subdivisions from all sources of taxes. No particular amount from the sales tax was suggested.

A 55 per cent majority to approve extra tax levies also was approved by the league, although Burgeon said he favored maintaining the present 65 per cent ruling. A change from the one-cent liquid fuel tax to a one-cent gasoline tax also was recommended by the league.

Mayor Ferguson was elected second vice president of the league while Amos L. Kaufman, Lakewood, was again named president. Norman La Faber was elected first vice president.

CRASH VICTIM'S BODY REMOVED TO ILLINOIS

FINDLAY, Dec. 7.—The body of Mark H. Jackson, 54, Bloomdale, who died Friday morning of injuries sustained when his automobile hit a culvert, was being removed today to Champaign, Ill., for funeral services.

Jackson was found in an unconscious condition along the highway in Route 281, by a school bus driver. He apparently had been thrown from his car by the force of the crash, which investigating officials estimated had occurred about two hours before.

CHICAGO, Dec. 7.—(INS)—Curiosity was turned to tragedy today for Donald Tuttle, 18-year-old high school student.

While on his way home last night from a men's store where he worked, Tuttle stopped to investigate a wrecked automobile which had plowed into a standing trolley.

Behind the wheel of the wrecked automobile was his father, Wilson Tuttle, 45, sales engineer, who was driving to the store to pick up his son.


