**Swift Anti-Strike Action Intimated**

WASHINGTON, Dec. 21.—(UP)—Republican leaders predicted today the new congress will react with "swift and drastic" anti-strike laws to any labor paralysis of basic industries in 1947.

One highly influential house Republican said there was at present "no disposition here to punish anyone or to retaliate against labor for the coal and automobile strikes."

"But another nationwide strike," he added, "would drive in the needle and might lead to anything."
