

Van Johnson and New Star Have Leads in Ohio's Film

Physicians in attendance said the quads were thriving and predicted that all would survive.

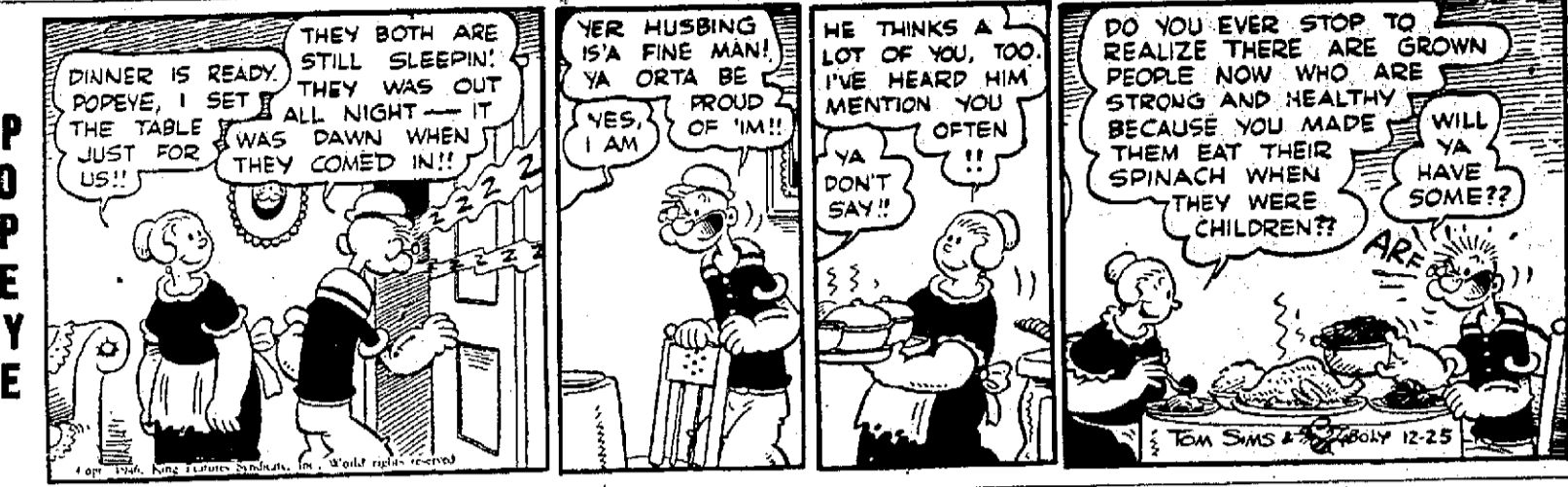
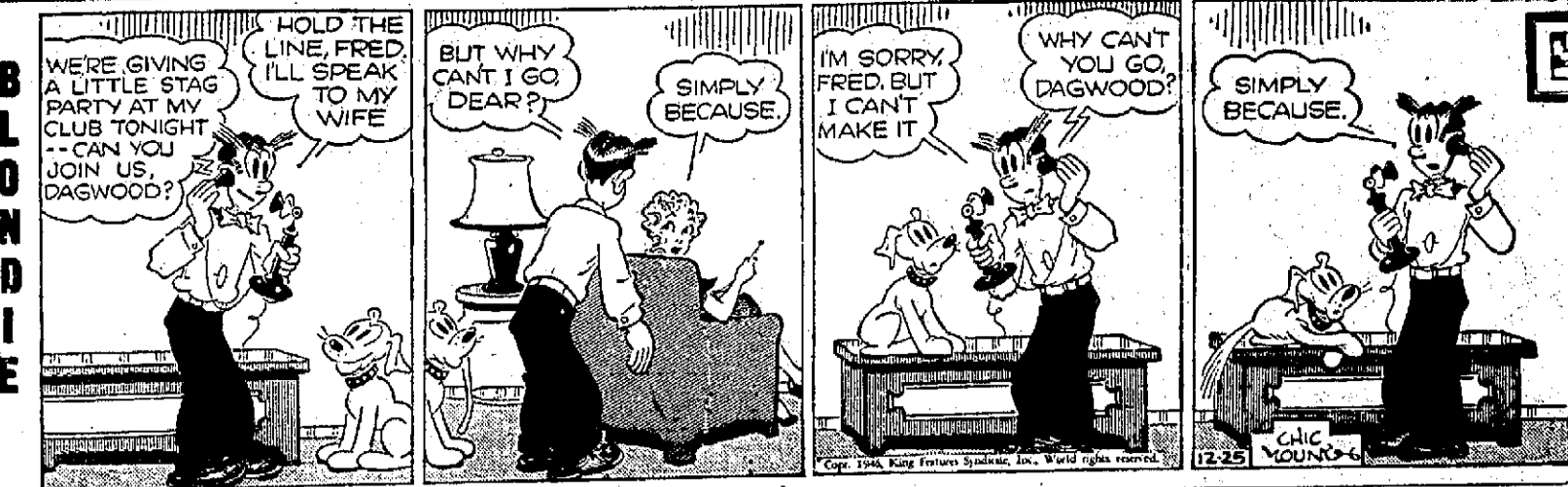
More Illegal Jews Heading Toward Zion

JERUSALEM, Dec. 26—(UP)—More illegal Jewish immigrants from Europe can be expected to reach Palestine shortly without trying to evade the British coastal blockade, it was learned today. One ship carrying between 3,000 and 4,000 refugees from Yugoslavia is expected to arrive at Haifa between Christmas and New Year's Day. It was believed that radar-equipped planes operating out of Haifa already have detected the ship.

Observers Say Bevin To Ask Showdown Poll
LONDON, Dec. 26—(INS)—London political writers predicted today that early in the new year Foreign Minister Ernest Bevin will deal with the rebel members of parliament who have attacked his policies. Bevin, they said, accuses them of "trying to stab him in the back at the most critical moment of his life." At the next meeting of the parliamentary Labor party the MP's, they said, will be asked to declare definitely whether they are behind Bevin or not. In effect, they explained, the foreign secretary will demand a unanimous vote of confidence from his own party before going to the Big Four foreign ministers council meeting in Moscow next March.
