Supply of Tires Nears Demand

AKRON, Dec. 27—(INS) — A balance between the supply and demand of tires during 1947 was predicted today in Akron by James Newman, vice president of the B. F. Goodrich Co.

The rubber executive also forecast that demand for tires will continue "relatively high" for at least five more years.

Barring serious work stoppages or shortages, Newman said, the coming year should match or surpass the all-time record in tire production of 87,000,000 units, achieved in 1946.

That figure, he asserted, does not include motorcycle or bicycle tires but exceeds the former record of 1941 by 23,000,000 units.

The long wait time gap in new auto production still is the main reason for tire scarcity, according to Goodrich company figures.

They show that 53,000,000 tires went out of wheels of American passenger cars as "replacements" this year against only 34,000,000 so used in 1941, the previous peak year.

Production of truck and bus tires for 1946 is estimated at 15,000,000 units, compared with 11,000,000 in 1941.
