GREAT BRITAIN PLANNING NEW DEFENSE LINE

Transfer from Middle East to Mid-Africa Bases Being Designed

COLUMBUS, Dec. 28-(AP)-Great Britain will withdraw from all her present Middle East bases and protect her lifelines from mid-Africa, a New Hampshire geographer predicted tonight.

"The future protection of herand the United States'-vast interests in the Middle East will be undertaken by a new defense-indepth system," declared Hans W. Weigert of Hancock, N. H., in a prepared address to the Association of American Geographers.

"Britain considers a transfer of her major bases from the Eastern Mediterranean to the heart of Africa, with main pillars in Kenya and Nigeria.


