So large were the throngs that concentrations in various favored spots looked for all the world, to a distant ob-server on shore, like "rafts of ducks" in the fall migra-

tion season. over the spot unsuspectingly the next day, after a light freeze, he might crash through the thin ice to his death.

But his reasonings and warnings neither abashed nor convinced the unorthodox fisherman. "I like to cut a hole big enough," he explained, "so the fish can swish around a bit before I land 'em."

Subsequent reference to the statutes, and inquiry at the conservation department, disclosed nothing in the present ice fishing regulations to restrict the size of a fishing hole.

There is a statute, outside the

fishing regulations, that might fit the situation, but some lawyers have expressed doubt about it because it was designed specfi cally to provide safeguards in commercial ice "removal." It is Sec. 340.67 and is entitled "Leaving Unguarded Ice Holes." reads:

"Any person who shall refrom any stream, pond or lake, and shall neglect to place around the margin of the opening made by such re-moval a fence, by setting posts of not less than two by four in size and with a fence board thoroughly nailed thereto not less than three and one half feet above the surface of the ice on said stream pond or lake, shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail not less than six months or by a fine not exceeding one hundred dol-

#### Reptiles Ruled Swamp Fossils Reveal

BERKELEY — (U.P.) — A description of American life 200,-000,000 years ago, when a large part of Arizona was swamp ruled by amphibious reptiles, is being written by paleontologists at the University of California.

Basis for the prehistoric history was provided by fossils found at Meteor crater and near Cameron and Holbrook, Arizona.

Dr. Samuel P. Welles, senior curator of the U. C. Museum of Paleontology, is preparing a paper to be released this month by the University of California Press on the 20,000,000 years just prior to the 100,000,000-million year reign of the dinosaurs.

Included among Dr. Weller's specimens are skulls of a group known as psuedo-sochians, reptwo-legged creatures. They prob-


