Farmers in Favor of Atomic Bomb
DES MOINES, Ia. (U.P.)—More than three-fourths of American farmers believe the United States should continue making atomic bombs for defense, a survey by the magazine, Successful Farming revealed.

Only 18 per cent of those interviewed favor stopping bomb production and destroying those already produced, the magazine said.

The survey showed that the farmers interviewed believed atomic bomb secrets should be withheld from Russia.

Views of an overwhelming majority point out that Russia would not allow a United Nations committee to investigate her country, even if the United States did destroy its bombs and stop production, the magazine said.

Pygmy Whale Wanted as Clue to 'Bends'
REHOBOTH BEACH, Del. (U.P.)—Seafarers along the Delaware cape have been asked to keep a weather eye peeled for a pygmy sperm whale in the interest of science.

The request was made by scientists at Swarthmore (Pa.) college, who want to examine the whale's circulatory system to determine why he is not affected by "bends," a type of cramps suffered by deep sea divers.

The 10-foot, 1,000-pound pygmy whale dives and rises with great speed, but never is troubled with the bends. To avoid cramps, humans have to descend and ascend in deep water in easy stages under controlled air pressure.
