### Madison UW Junior Named for Day Award

Donald B. Easum, Madison, a junior at the University of Wisconsin majoring in American institutions, has been selected to receive this year's Kenneth Sterling Day award.

The award was established in 1923 in memory of Kenneth Sterling Day, a student who died while a junior at the university in 1921. The Kenneth Sterling Day memorial stands in the lobby of the University YMCA with the names of those who received the award, inscribed on the globe hearing the following statement: "So long as the earth shall bear such names as these, so long shall hope remain."

The award is given on the basis of moral character, interest in religious activities, influence upon constructive forces in campus life, scholastic standing, and participation in sports.

Easum was a candidate for Rhodes scholar competition in 1946, and in addition to membership in both the university band and orchestra, has played trumpet for the Madison Civic orchestra. He is also a member of the varsity tennis team.

Last year's winner of the award was Donald Hyzer, a student of mechanical engineering from Reedsburg.
