City Relief Appointment Extended

Acting City Manager Kraege today appointed Lillian Nitcher assistant city relief director on a three-month provisional basis upon expiration of Miss Nitcher's temporary appointment as acting director.

Of four candidates certified last spring for the permanent directorship succeeding Thomas J. Doran, resigned, only one has signified interest in the position in recent inquiries, Kraege reported.

The old city council temporarily dropped the attempt to appoint a permanent director last spring and extended Miss Nitcher's appointment as acting director for three months after interviewing four candidates. The only one of these still indicating interest, Kraege reported, was John H. Fritz, field representative at Oakshof for the Citizens Public Expenditures survey and formerly of Madison. Others certified were Frank F. Finley, Crawford County welfare director; Clayton D. Harrop, North Freedom, Sauk county relief di-

rector, and Robert S. Baldwin, Sparta, Monroe county welfare department case worker.
