

Notes from Bill Doudna

SYMPHONY: Musicians from several other symphony orchestras will be in the ranks of the University Symphony when it performs at 8 tonight in the Wisconsin Union theater under the direction of Prof. Richard C. Church. Conductors and music educators also will be among the orchestra's 76 members.

Lee Hoiby, senior in the university music school, will be soloist, playing the Liszt-Busoni "Spanish Rhapsody."

Church has long been one of Madison's outstanding musical personalities—as director of instrumental music at Madison West high school, conductor of the University Symphony orchestra, guest conductor with bands and orchestras, musical director of three shows on the campus, and member of the University and Madison Civic Symphony orchestras. In addition, he has distinguished himself as an actor.

Mildred Stanke, solo cellist with the Madison Civic Symphony;

Julius Levine, who this fall will become a member of the Brooklyn Symphony;

Larry Intravala, of the Wichita Symphony;

Robert Williams, former member of the Little Rock Symphony;

Margaret Rupp Cooper, Madison harpist and harp teacher.

The orchestra's selections will be "Prelude in E Minor," Bach; "Symphony No. 4," Mendelssohn; "A Night on Bald Mountain," Moussorgsky; "Russian Sailor Dance," Gliere, and "Intermezzo" from "Hasan," Delius.

Admission will be free to University of Wisconsin students and other Wisconsin Union members; the latter, however, must pay a federal tax. The general public may attend by paying a small fee.



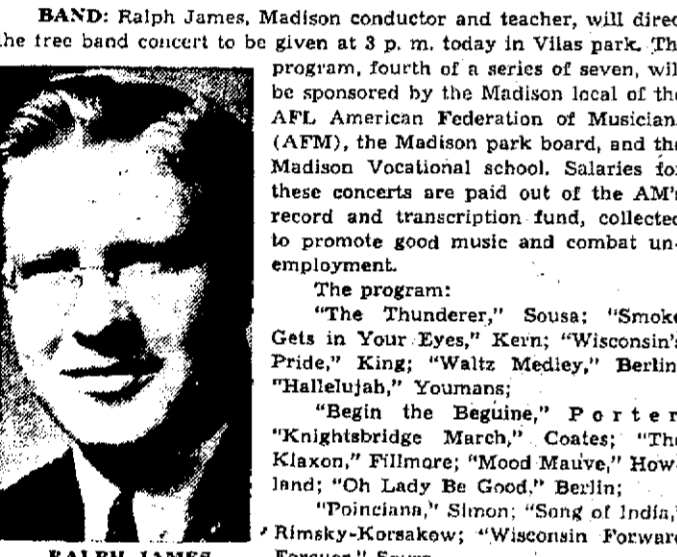

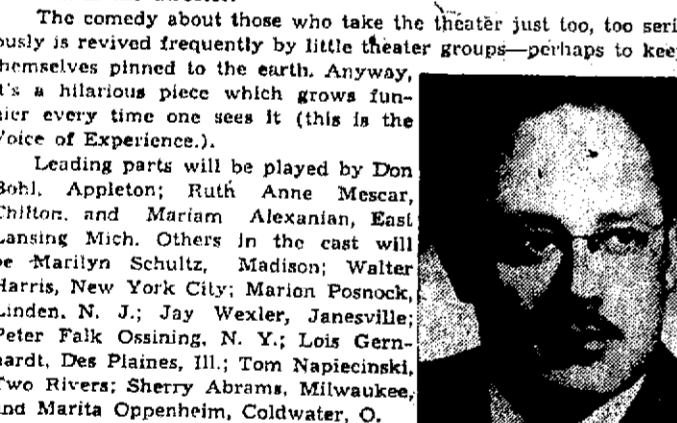
