EGYPT FIGHTS CHOLERA

CAIRO, Sept. 25.—(AP) The government officially declared Egypt a cholera-stricken country tonight and said international health organizations had been advised.

Earlier public health ministry sources reported that the first two cases had appeared in Cairo and that in all Egypt there was a total of 57 cases.

Entrances to Egypt's capital were closed yesterday. The Ministry of the Interior today banned further Moslem pilgrimages to Mecca this year and the Ministry of Education indefinitely postponed next month's reopening of schools.

'CELEBRATION' LANDS MAN BACK IN JAIL

Two men were arrested at the Christian Union about 5:30 p.m. yesterday after one of them sustained severe head injuries when struck by a bottle thrown by the second man who police said was "celebrating" his release from the County jail earlier in the day.

The injured man, Joseph Balush, 34, of 827 Water street, was removed by Dr. Isidore Yasser, City ambulance surgeon, to St. Vincent's hospital where 12 stitches were required to close the wounds.

Identified as the injured man's opponent, Joseph McCarrier, 50, of the Grand Hotel, who police said had just completed a 10-day sentence for drunkenness, was held in bonds of \$1,000 on an assault charge.

After his release from the hospital, Balush was arrested by Radio Patrolmen John Scanlon and John Leahy and held in bonds of \$200 on a charge of breach of the peace.
