Among Week's New Shows

Although the World Series baseball games are the most important features on the air this week to sports-minded fans, radio listeners will find numerous changes taking place on broadcasting schedules this week, including the premieres of Paul Whiteman's talent quest, Jimmy Durante's new show, Al Jolson on "Music Hall," and the new "Spotlight Revue" with Dorothy Shay and Spike Jones' City Slickers.

This week also brings back for another season Amos 'n' Andy, Bing Crosby, Abbott and Costello, Lionel Barrymore, "Vox Pop," "Duffy's Tavern," "Aldrich Family," "Chapel Echoes," "First Nighter" and Kay Kyser, while "Lum and Abner," Lowell Thomas and Bob Hawk shift to different networks.

Today's premieres include "Hollywood Star Preview," featuring new Hollywood talent in dramas

WNBC at 9 p. m., with Eddle ("The Waiter"), Green, Charlie ("Clifton Finnegan") Cantor, Matty Malneck's orchestra and guests. Abbott and Costello begin their new WNAB-ABC series at 9 p. m., with Susan Miller as singing star. Jack Paar, Jack Benny's summer replacement, moves his comedy show to WNAB-ABC at 9:30 p. m. Bing Crosby begins another year of his transcribed series over WNAB-ABC at 10 p. m.

"Racket Smashers," round-table discussions by such crime experts as Burton Turkus, former Brooklyn D. A., begin over WICC-MBS at 10 p. m. Jimmy Durante begins his new WNBC series at 10:30, with Arthur Treacher and Candy Candido as his comedy assistants; Peggy Lee singing star, and Tom Harmon, football authority. Roy Barry conducts the radio play "The Most Dangerous Game" as the curtain-raiser.

THURSDAY NIGHT
"The Aldrich Family," starring Ezra Stone as Henry, with Jack Kelly as Homer, House Jameson and Katharine Raft as Henry's parents, Mary Rolfe as his sister Mary and Mary Shipp as his girl friend Kathleen, returns to WNBC at 8 p. m. "Treasury Agent," dramatizing crime-busting adventures of the T-Men moves into the 8 o'clock spot on WNAB-ABC.

Al Jolson becomes singing emcee of the WNBC Music Hall at 9 p. m., with Oscar Levant, Milena Miller, Lou Brigg's orchestra and guests. Bob Hawk moves his quiz to WNBC at 10 p. m.

"Mr. President," starring Edward Arnold in dramatizations of events in the lives of our presidents, moves to WNAB-ABC at 10 p. m.

FRIDAY NIGHT
"Can You Top This?" starring Senator Ed Ford, Harry Herzhoff and Joe Laurie, Jr., in jockeying competitions, moves to WNBC at 8:30 p. m.

Ted Lewis show, featuring the top-hatted clarinetist and his band with guest stars, makes its debut on WNBC at 8:30 p. m. "Spotlight Revue," with Spike Jones, City Slickers and Dorothy Shay, "Park Avenue Hillbilly," starts over WNBC at 10:30 p. m.

SATURDAY
"The Youth Forum," teen-age discussions of current events, resumes over WQXR at 10:30 a. m., with Dorothy Gordon as moderator.

Col. Steepland becomes comedy star of the Vaughn Monroe show over WNBC at 9:30. Judy Canova moves her comedy show ahead to 9:30 on WNBC. Kay Kyser returns with his "Comedy of Errors," featuring his orchestra and Ish Kabibble, over WNBC at 10 p. m.

WORLD SERIES PLANS
A half-hour preview of the World Series is scheduled to be broadcast at 9:30 over WICC-MBS, the same network over which the Series games will be broadcast by Red Barber and Mel Allen as regular commentators. A half-hour program of recorded highlights of the games, with commentary by Star Lomax, is to be broadcast by WOR at 11:30 p. m. on days when a game is played.


