Beginning Oct. 1. The Wisconsin State Journal will no longer print stock quotations from the New York and Chicago exchanges. On that date newspaper mechanical departments begin working a 37½-hour week under union agreements. With the end of daylight saying time, the stock exchanges close an hour later. These two factors make it physically impossible to publish closing quotations, and still deliver the newspaper to subscribers on time. The Wisconsin State Journal is one of the few afternoon papers in the United States which attempted to publish market reports in its home editions. 


