

# Wilson Eleven Held to Tie by Whittier Grids, 13-13

## Bruins Hold Big Edge

It was a damp night for football, and even damper for the Bruins of Wilson High, as Jim Lineberger's charges had to be content with a 13-13 tie in their Pacific League opener at Whittier last night. Both teams were held back by a wet ball and a heavy field, but the Bruins dominated play for the most part, running up 16 to 7 in first downs and 262 yards 31 from net rushing.

Whittier tailed first in the opening period. It all began when Wilson was backed down to its own four, and on the punt-out officials ruled interference on the receiver against the Bruins. This put the Cardinals on the Wilson 15. Korn passed to Foss for a first down on the one, from where Irwin plunged over for the score. Wilson came roaring right back, however, taking the kick-off and traveling 72 yards right down the center of the field in eight plays. Gene Painter sparked the drive with several sizable gains, and Ray Hale did touch-down honors from the three. Bill Obenauer rounded end for the conversion.

### SCORES AGAIN

Early in the third period, Whittier went back in the lead when Korn hit Irwin on a spot pass for 37 yards, and Hookstratten drop-kicked the extra point.

Once again the Bruins came back with fire in their eyes, grabbing the kickoff and rolling 60 yards to knot the count. Obenauer and Painter alternated on the ball for much of the way, with Painter doing honor to his time from the nine. Summary:


