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ANSWERS TO Carnival QUESTIONS

Q. Where is the largest double-deck bridge in the world? J. B.

A. The largest double-deck steel bridge in the world is the San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge. The total length of the bridge including approaches is 8½ miles. Its principal portion, from the San Francisco anchorage to the Oakland shore, has a length of 4½ miles and spans 3½ miles of water. Two spans, each 2810 feet, in the West Bay crossing are the longest in the bridge.

Q. How long must a war bride remain in this country before she can become a citizen? H. W. S.

A. An alien wife of a United States citizen cannot become naturalized until she has resided in this country for two years. She may then apply for final naturalization papers, first papers in this case being unnecessary.

Q. Who was the first person to step upon Plymouth Rock in 1620? L. V. R.

A. John Alden usually is named as the first person to set foot upon the rock. However, the distinction has also been claimed for Mary Chilton. Although some historians have discredited the tradition that the Pilgrims stepped on this rock from their ship Mayflower; popular sentiment clings to it.

A. Officially this group of volunteer workers of the American Red Cross is known as the Hospital and Recreation Corps. Members are called Gray Ladies from the color of their uniforms.
