Q. Where is the largest double-deck bridge in the world?
J. B.
A. The largest double-deck steel bridge in the world is the San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge. The total length of the bridge including approaches is 8 1/2 miles. Its principal portion, from the San Francisco anchorage to the Oakland shore, has a length of 4 1/2 miles and spans 3 1/2 miles of water. Two spans, each 2810 feet, in the West Bay crossing are the longest in the bridge.
Q. How long must a war bride remain in this country before she can become a citizen?

A. An alien wife of a United States citizen cannot become naturalized until she has resided in this country for two years. She may then apply for final naturalization papers, first papers in this case being unnecessary.
Q. Who was the first person to step upon Plymouth Rock in 1820?

A. John Alden usually is named as the first person to set foot upon the rock. However, the distinction has also been claimed for Mary Chilton. Although some historians have discredited the tradition that the Pilgrims stepped on this rock from their ship, Mayflower, popular sentiment clings to it.

THE DOUBLE of a three no trump contract not only says that you expect to beat the contract, but it also asks your partner to lead the first suit bid by dummy.
This convention works out very well if the dummy has bid your suit, and you have a good suit with a sure entry. But it can be quite disastrous when the opponents' bidding has been strong.
In today's hand South elected to open the bidding with one diamond even though he had a point count sufficient to bid one no trump. North responded with one spade to fill that hole in case his partner wanted to play the hand at no trump.
South's bid of two no trump was an overbid. Nevertheless, it was a powerful bid, and when North went to three no trump, East should not have applied the convention of the double for the
