FASCISM

Comes to Bridgeport

On Sunday night, a rally planned by the Communist Party of Bridgeport, was broken up by a mob of veterans. They prevented a group of American citizens, including a large number of veterans who also fought for democracy, from exercising their Constitutional rights of peaceable assembly and free speech. This mob-set itself up above the law and trampled the Constitution under its feet.

We know that the rank and file veterans, numbering tens of thous-ands resent the way this day of mourning for the war dead was disgraced by this fascist hooliganism.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 18. - (AP) The "Battle of Newark Bay" ended tonight with agreement among the feuding city officials and a salvere company, and the city called off its "embattled" fireboats.

Under the agreement Morris E. Lipsett, salvage operator, will scrap three battleships over the next nine months at Port Newark.

The Port of New York Authority will begin Sept. 1, 1948, its \$11,000; 000 development of the Port Newark harbor, Austin J. Tobin, executive director, announced.

The battleships to be scrapped are the New Mexico, the Idaho and the Wyoming. They will provide a total of 65,000 tons of scrap. The New Mexico, anchored off New York Harbor, will move in first thing tomorrow morning, Lip-

Kenney, who was praised by Mayor Murphy for his peace-maker, role, said the scrap shortage throughout the country made it imperative he do everything he could to get the old battleship scrapped. the same time, he said, he wanted to assist "my good friend Mayor Murphy" in his plans to develop Port Newark harbor.





sett said.
