FASCISM Comes to Bridgeport On Sunday night, a rally planned by the Communist Party of Bridgeport, was broken up by a mob of veterans. They prevented a group of American citizens, including a large number of veterans who also fought for democracy, from exercising their Constitutional rights of peaceful assembly and free speech. This mob set itself up above the law and trampled the Constitution under its feet. Make no mistake about it — this is Fascism and they were the Stormtroopers of Fascism. This attack on civil liberties in Bridgeport is not an isolated case. A Communist Party rally was broken up in Trenton; in Newark, attempts were made to break up a Frank Kingdon-PCA meeting; in Philadelphia a group of Hollywood personalities were prevented from speaking; in California, it was a Democratic Party meeting that was broken up. The issue is not Communism — the issue is democracy. Today it is the Communists who are prevented from exercising their rights. Tomorrow it will be the vast majority (the Negroes, the Jews, the trade unionists, the Catholics). This is history; this is the way it happened in Italy, in Germany, in Spain—wherever Fascism came into power. We pay tribute to the true defenders of democracy — the more than 200 citizens, both Negro and White, who courageously walked through the lynch mob into the meeting. We pay tribute, also, to the several hundred on the outside who were prevented from coming into the hall. We are sure that the leaders of the Veterans' Council, who incited the mob, do not represent the views or the interests of the people of Bridgeport. We know that the rank and file veterans, numbering tens of thousands resent the way this day of mourning for the war dead was disgraced by this fascist hooliganism. Mayor McLevy, who was warned that attempts would be made to break up the meeting, was present at the scene and did nothing to curb the hysteria and incitement to violence. Protest to the Mayor and Chief of Police against this outrage. Demand that the Constitutional rights of all citizens be upheld. "We (you) must organize now our resistance movement to preserve democracy or we shall have to organize underground later to win it back." — Henry Wallace Nov. 10, 1947. 'NEWARK BATTLE' ENDS AS 'NAVY' IS DEMOBILIZED

WASHINGTON, Nov. 18. — (AP) The "Battle of Newark Bay" ended tonight with agreement among the feuding city officials and a salvage company, and the city called off its "embattled" fireboats. Undersecretary of the Navy W. John Kenney announced settlement of the widely publicized dispute over scrapping the old battleship New Mexico on Newark's waterfront. "Navy" Demobilized And Mayor Vincent Murphy of Newark said he was demobilizing the fireboats, which have been valiantly blocking the channel to the scrapping yard with their brass water nozzles for the past week. The objection was that the scrapping operations would delay the planned development of Newark's waterfront. Under the agreement Morris E. Lipsett, salvage operator, will scrap three battleships over the next nine months at Port Newark. The Port of New York Authority will begin Sept. 1, 1948, its \$11,000,000 development of the Port Newark harbor, Austin J. Tobin, executive director, announced. The battleships to be scrapped are the New Mexico, the Idaho and the Wyoming. They will provide a total of 65,000 tons of scrap. The New Mexico, anchored off New York Harbor, will move in first thing tomorrow morning, Lipsett said. Kenney, who was praised by Mayor Murphy for his peace-maker role, said the scrap shortage throughout the country made it imperative he do everything he could to get the old battleship scrapped. At the same time, he said, he wanted to assist "my good friend Mayor Murphy" in his plans to develop Port Newark harbor.
