Confused Bowl Picture Finally Begins to Clear

NEW YORK.—(U.P.—) Southern California and Michigan were set for the Rose Bowl today, and it looked like SMU vs. Penn State in the Cotton and Alabama vs. Texas in the Sugar.

The Orange Bowl remained anybody's guess. Southern California clinched the western end of the Rose Bowl with its thrill-tipped 6-0 victory over UCLA Saturday.

Michigan already sewed up the eastern end with its win over Wisconsin, and then beat Ohio State, 21-0, just for the record Saturday.

Negro Problem Rises
The Cotton Bowl seemed pointing for the only post-season classic matching two undefeated and untied teams. The racial barriers against inviting Penn State, with its two Negro players, seemed to be crumbling.

SMU squeezed out a 10-0 win over Baylor, and needs but only TCU this week for a perfect record. The Mustangs already have clinched at least one game for the Southwest Conference championship and Texas, which may be indicated it would not contest the Cotton Bowl bid in the event of a tie deadlock.

Cotton Bowl and SMU officials, including Coach Matty Bell, who sent a scout to the Penn State-Pitt game which Penn State won, 29-0, said that there was no objection to the Negroes playing in the Dallas, Tex., game. However, they pointed out that the colored boys might have to stay in hotels apart from the remainder of the squad.

Orange Bowl Unsettled
Coach Bob Higgins of Penn State said Sunday night that would be all right and he'd look as though Penn State was "in." Otherwise, Kansas, co-champ with Oklahoma in the Big Six and unbeaten though tied once, seemed a good bet, as did Georgia Tech.

Alabama accepted a Sugar Bowl invitation Saturday after whaling LSU, 41-12, and it seemed certain that Texas would be the opponent if the once-beaten Longhorns down the Aggies Thursday.

The Orange Bowl at Miami, Fla., eyes either Mississippi, with its famed Charley Conely, or Georgia Tech, beaten only by Alabama, as the host team. Mississippi, which is contracted with the Memphis, Tenn., Delta Bowl, may try to get out of that for an Orange Bowl invite, even though the Memphis people say they won't release the Rebels.

Army Meets Navy
Mississippi meets Mississippi State and Georgia Tech plays Georgia Saturday in a couple of those traditional anything-can-happen. State licked Mississippi Southern, 14-7. Tech crushed Chattanooga, 51-0. Georgia downed Chattanooga, 27-0, and Mississippi was off Saturday.

For an opponent, the Orange Bowl might take either William and Mary, the Southern Conference champ, or twice-beaten North Carolina, which licked Duke, 21-0, Saturday. W & M met Richmond this week after defeating Bowling Green 20-0, but the title was already in the bag.

Too, the Orange Bowl might get Kansas if Penn State goes to the Cotton Bowl. This week favored Army meets Navy.
