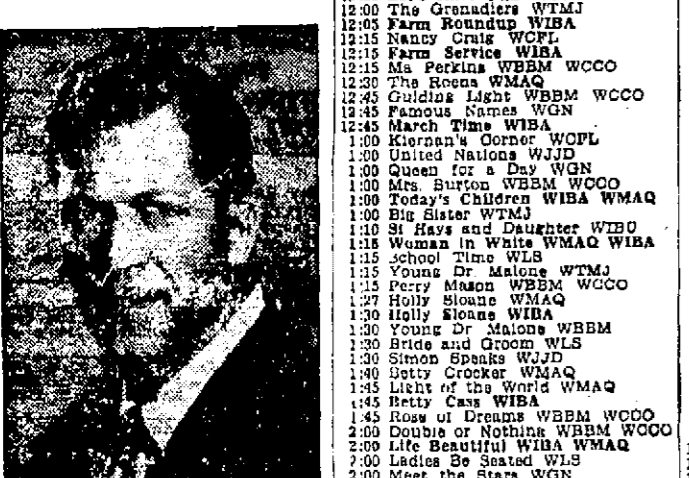

Standard Asks Probe by SEC

Wants Study of Preference Group

PHILADELPHIA — (U.P.)—Council for Standard Gas and Electric Co. today petitioned the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) to investigate a protective committee for the Chicago holding company's \$7 and \$6 prior preference stockholders.

Charging alleged relations between the committee and the company's ousted Executive Head, Leo T. Crowley, Standard asked the SEC to inquire as to whether there was any inside information given to committee members to foster their buying and selling of Standard stocks.

Filed by Counsel The petition was filed by Standard's special counsel, Alfred Bertram, as the commission continued its investigation of a management shake-up within the \$700,000,000 utilities system.

In testimony given last week, Crowley denied any association with the protective committee. Specifically, the petition asked the SEC to investigate "whether the substantial amounts of trading of Standard's prior preference stocks carried on by various of the committee members in the course of the reorganization, and the timing of such purchases and sales in relation to various earlier plans filed by Standard, tends to establish that advance information was furnished to such members by or through members of Standard's management."

Wagner Heads Group The committee is headed by John P. Wagner, Chicago. Other members include John H. Harmon, also of Chicago; Edward M. Goemans, Encino, Calif.; and J. J. Shouse, former national chairman of the Democratic party.

The petition also alleged that Shouse has had important political connections and associations with Crowley over the past 20 years, and charged that statements filed by the committee regarding their past relations with the company management (prior to the shakeup) were "incomplete and false."
