**STREPTOMYCIN CURBS DISEASES IN PLANTS**  
 TUCSON, Ariz.—(UP) Dr. J. G. Brown of the University of Arizona reports that streptomycin—the latest wonder drug in the fight against human ailments—has been used successfully to combat plant diseases.  
 Dr. Brown said that in experiments here, the antibiotic drug has been used satisfactorily in the disinfection of plum and budwood areas without harm to the plants.  
 He added that streptomycin was particularly effective in killing plant germs which cause rot and blackspot.  
 "Thus far, he said, it has been found that the drug will make it possible to grow uninfected nursery stock, even of very susceptible varieties, such as Japanese plum."
