

High-priced Pork May Drain Grain

WASHINGTON, Dec. 6. (4P) There is a possibility that grain being saved now by farmers through selling livestock early and at light weights may be fed to animals later instead of being made available for shortage

This possibility is one of the things the Truman administration had in mind when it suggested to Congress that there may be need for price control and rationing of meats.

Right now there is little finan-cial incentive for the average farmer to fatten hogs to heavy weights. If he has to buy corn, the price is too high, considering the fact that it takes more grain to put a pound of gain on heavy hogs than light weight ones.

Hog feeding operations are con-derably less favorable now than earlier in the fall. Hogs brought farmers an average of \$27.60 a attners an average of \$27.60 a undred pounds in mid-October. By mid-November they had propped to an average of \$24.20.
