parts would prefer to open it with a club. I thought that the opponents might make four hearts, and that was the reason I went to five hearts. When West bid five hearts, the Navy took command and went to six diamonds. There was no question from the look in his face that he intended to make it.

He won the opening lead in dummy with the ace of spades, cashed the ace of diamonds and led a small diamond back to dummy's king. On the ace and queen of clubs he discarded his two losing spades, then played the four of hearts. West quickly took his ace, and the captain spread his hand, claiming the balance.
