

# Herbert Anderson Celebrates 20th Anniversary on WICC

Dean of Bridgeport broadcasters, Herbert Anderson will celebrate his 20th anniversary on Station WICC when his "Chapel Echoes" program is broadcast next Saturday at 6:30 p.m., making him eligible for radio's "Twenty Year Club."

Although he is employed at the Bridgeport Post Office, Mr. Anderson's career has been closely associated with the history of Bridgeport's oldest radio station. Even his marriage is a radio romance. It was on Jan. 17, 1928, that Mr. Anderson made his radio debut on WICC. He had passed his audition with Charles Dunn with flying colors. And next Saturday, when he marks his 20th anniversary, he will be doing his 26th broadcast.

Jingberg Johnson, now married and living in Worcester, Mass., was his first accompanist. Through the years, his accompanists have been Judson LaHaye, now on the Fordham faculty; Lou Wells, now living in Pennsylvania; N. J. Marie Minotti and once, in a pinch during an ion storm, Herb accompanied himself—although he had never had actual pianist training. His present accompanist, Gertrude Hanson, has been with "Chapel Echoes" since its inception following the conclusion of Mr. Anderson's solo programs.

"Herb" as he is affectionately known in the WICC studios, made his first broadcast in the old studios at 1044 Main street, moving to the present studios in the Stratford in March, 1932. His announcements through the years have been Charles Dunn, Arthur Whitman, James Milne, Judson LaHaye, Edward Lusk, George Bows, Irving Friedberg, Robert Parker, Walter Kluvin, Carleton (Waldenhamer) Warren, Bill Elliott, Lou La Haye, Law Dearborn, John Montgomery, Ken Rapch and Station Manager Joseph Lopez.

Anderson's radio romance dates back to a guest appearance by the Bethany Girls Quartet of WDRG, Hartford, on "Chapel Echoes" both groups having listened to each other many times. In the quartet was Signe Lagerlof of New Britain—who became Mrs. Anderson in August, 1940. They now have a four-year-old son, Tommy.

Mrs. Anderson is now a member of his "Chapel Echoes" program with Mrs. William Gruber, soprano; Gilbert Johnson, bass; Helmer Nelson, first tenor; Carleton Soderholm, second tenor; "Herb" himself, baritone, and Miss Hanson, the accompanist.
