Q. In what year was the largest number of automobiles registered in the United States? J. M.

A. The highest registration was for the year 1947 when the estimated total number of motor vehicles was 37,164,405, compared with the previous record of 34,472,416 in 1946. This represented a gain of 7.8 per cent over 1941 despite the continued shortages of new passenger cars and trucks.

Q. Who was the lawyer who defended the schoolboy in the famous Archer-Mee case on which a current play is reputedly based? What became of the boy? S. M.

A. Sir Edward Carson, the noted Irish-born jurist (1854-1935), was the lawyer in the Archer-Mee case over which all England was aroused. The case concerned the rights of 13-year-old George Archer-Mee, who was dismissed from the Royal Naval College at Osborne in 1903 after having been accused of stealing a five-shilling postal order. The case came to trial in July, 1910, and the boy was exonerated. George Archer-Mee was killed in France in World War I.

Q. When was the Junior Red Cross established? D. McN.

A. The American Junior Red Cross was established by President Wilson in September, 1917. With a membership of more than 19,000,000 boys and girls, this is the largest youth organization in the world.

Q. How many courses are there in a complete dinner menu? O. F. F.

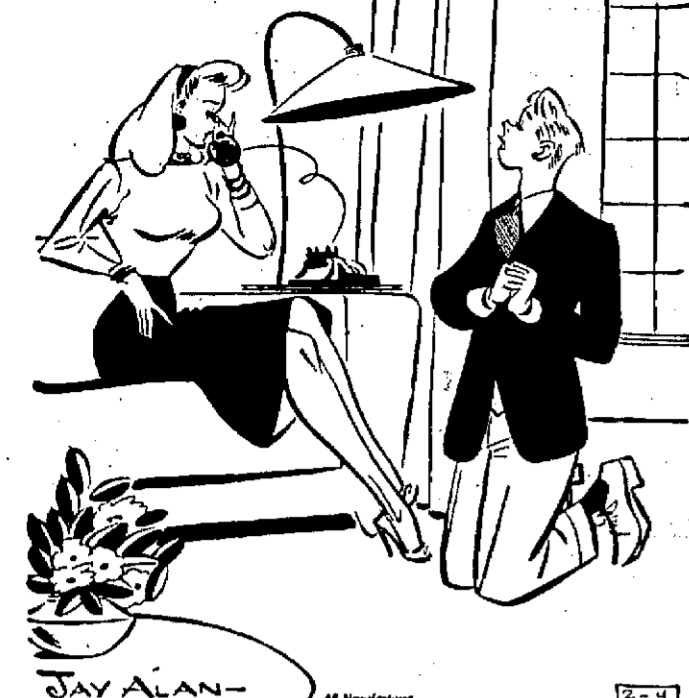

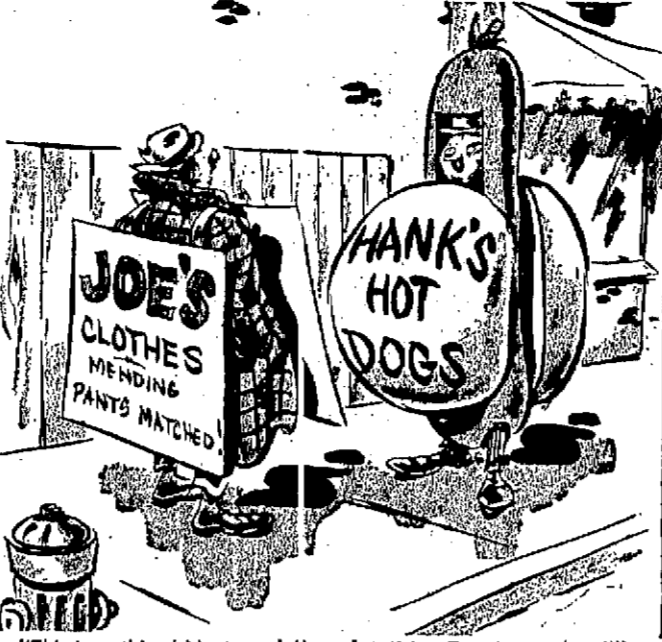

At this point he played the ace of clubs, then the jack of spades. West covered with the king and the ace in dummy won. On the king and queen of clubs he discarded the ten and the nine of spades, then led a small heart and finessed the ten spot.
