Stove Blast Kills Woman, Five Children

MT. PLEASANT, Mich. —(U.P.)—A father lay in critical condition in Mt. Clemens community hospital today, the only survivor of a violent home explosion and fire which claimed the lives of his wife and five children.

Roy Wohlshaid, 35, escaped when a cooking stove blast sent flames racing through the six-room home Sunday. But Mrs. Wohlshaid, 27; Roy, Jr., 10; Beverly, 9; Richard, 7; Dale, 5; and Patricia, 2, were screamed.

Heard Wife Scream

Wohlshaid said he was trying to break down the door to the kitchen when he was flattened by the explosion. He had run to the kitchen when he heard his wife scream.

When the blast hit, he stumbled into the front yard and extinguished his flaming clothes in the snow. He told police he was trying to get back in through a rear door when he collapsed.

Rescued by Neighbors

Neighbors rescued Wohlshaid from the debris-strewn floor where he lay. They also helped firemen remove the bodies of the rest of the family—Mrs. Wohlshaid from a bedroom where she apparently hurried in an attempt to save her children.

The blaze, fed by a broken gas main, completely destroyed gas main, destroyed the house. Firemen battled in zero weather to bring it under control.

5-room house "like a broken orange crate" and injured one person.

Three members of the Nels Juul family, occupants of the house, were unhurt. But Otto Schatz, 51, a visitor, was hospitalized with a broken knee, cuts, and possible internal injuries. He was blown out of the house.

Police Captain Charles Merriman said the blast may have been caused by a gas leak in an automatic water heater in the basement.
