Barclay on Bridge

Most bridge books and most bridge instructors, both amateur and professional, teach that a singleton in the declarer's hand has no value if the deal is being played at a suit contract. A singleton in the dummy is very useful, as a rule, they point out, because it affords an opportunity for the declarer to ruff out one or more of his own losers with the dummy's trumps. But the singleton is valuable also in the declarer's hand when it enables him to gain control earlier and thereby wind up with one or more additional tricks.

Peter Waldo was one of the early Protestants. The Waldenses suffered because of their faith in him and took refuge in the Alps of France.

For Independence day, the Waldenses plan to hold an old-world dinner at their church and hear an address by Mrs. Catherine Anderson of New York, secretary of the American Waldensian Aid society.

The Waldenses' original idea when they migrated to the North Carolina mountains was to establish an agricultural community. However, new occupations sprang up and today most of them are in
