



DES MOINES, Ia.-(U.P)-When you have sniffles, don't plan on getting over them for at least a

week. That's the advice of Dr. H. E. Ransom, director of the Des Moines health department.

"Instead of just lasting three days as colds do in the average year, the 1948 cold is lasting at least a week," he said. Dr. Robert I. Parker, medical director of the board of education, agreed.

Aches, Pains and Fever Dr. Ransom said the difference in this year's cold crop is that victims have been suffering from severe sore throats, aches and pains of the body, and in some cases, fever.

The cold is hanging on longer

this year because of the "sever-ity" of the virus infection, he explain**ed.**

Virus Blamed Dr. Ransom described the virus as an "influenza virus" and added that the only difference between the common cold and in-fluenza is the question of viru-
