Gould Heiress Wants Secret Divorce Trial

PHOENIX, Ariz.—(U.P.)—Attorneys for heiress Gioia Grinditch, 24, will ask the court to keep the trial of divorce charges against her, it was reported today.
 The beautiful, brown-eyed great-granddaughter of railroad tycoon Jay Gould was accused of intimacies with several men in a divorce cross-complaint filed by her husband, Henry Grinditch, jr., of Rydal, Pa.
 Grinditch, a Harvard student and former junior men's ice skating champion, made the same charges in a \$250,000 federal court damage suit.
 The divorce action will be heard jointly with Grinditch's habeas corpus action to obtain custody of their children, Bill, 3, and Gioia, 2.
 He said his wife recorded the alleged intimacies in a diary introduced as a court exhibit when depositions were taken in a closed hearing Saturday.
 Grinditch's attorney, former Gov. Philip F. La Follette of Wisconsin, said his client has no objection to a public trial but he probably will not oppose his wife's request for a closed hearing.
 The couple married in New York May 17, 1943.

Illinois Plans to 'Salvage' Young Killer

CHICAGO—(U.P.)—The state of Illinois gambled today that it could turn the youngest confessed murderer in its history into a law-abiding citizen.
 Prosecution and defense lawyers reached an agreement this weekend, under which Howard Lang, 13, pleaded guilty to stabbing his playmate Lonnie Fellich, 7, and hammering him to death with a sledge hammer.
 As a result, Lang probably will be placed in a juvenile institution until he becomes of age. The state will forego taking its usual "payment to society," gambling that he can be molded into a useful member of the community if he is not subjected to the company of hardened criminals in a regular prison.

Sentenced Next Month

Lang will be sentenced some time after Mar. 5, the date Judge Daniel A. Roberts said he will hear defense attorneys argue their beliefs that Lang's crime resulted from his rearing in a poor neighborhood and broken home.
 Dr. Roy G. Barrick, chief state criminologist, said Lang would be given special attention at whatever institution he enters. He expressed confidence that Lang could be rehabilitated because he is "the most plastic age, when there is greatest hope for proper guidance."
 "I don't know how Howard Lang will come out," Barrick said, "but he will get the chance to come out a good man."
 Warden Frank Sain of the Cook county jail was of the same opinion.
 He said Lang prayed Sunday at services conducted at the jail. It was the first time since he was arrested last fall that Lang attended the prayer meeting.
 Wants to be Carpenter
 Lang told reporters today that he will try to learn the carpenter's trade during the time he is under state custody.
 "They make a lot of money," he said.
 He did not speak of the murder in which he knifed and battered the Fellich boy to death last Oct. 18 in a wooded section outside Chicago. The murder occurred during an argument over \$10 Lang had stolen from his mother.
 Lang said he had one word of advice he'd like to pass on to other children.
 "I'd tell them to remember one thing—hold your temper."
