the English quart? C. S. B. A. The only measure common to both countries is the reputed quart bottle of one-sixth English gallon or 26 2-3 Entitish ounces. This bottle is exactly one-fifth of an American gallon; hence it is known as the fifth bottle in the United States. This Ameri-can fifth bottle (or British re-puted quart bottle) holds 25 3-5 American ounces. It is equal to four-fifths of an American quart, hence whisky shipped from England to the United States usually carries on the label the legend "four-fifth quart."
