

ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS

Q. When a fresco painting is being done, are the colors applied directly to the wall? C. C.

A. In fresco painting the colors are applied with water as a vehicle directly on a wet plaster wall and allowed to dry.

Q. In what publication are executive orders printed? O. W. S.

A. In 1935 Congress passed a law (the Federal Register Act) which required that all executive orders, decrees and proclamations having general application and legal effect must be published in the Federal Register, which is issued daily.

Q. With what countries has the United States been at war? Has the United States ever been at war with Russia? B. C.

A. The United States has been at war at one time or another with the principal nations of the world, including Great Britain, France, Germany, Italy, Mexico, Spain and Japan, but it has never been at war with Russia.

Q. Will children born of United States citizen parents in United States occupied areas abroad be eligible for President of the United States? G. G. H.

A. The question of Presidentialial eligibility of children born abroad of American parents has never been judicially interpreted. It will probably not be so interpreted unless some Presidential aspirant brings the problem into court.

Q. Please quote the lines from Pindar that are inscribed on the Wright Memorial at Kitty Hawk, N. C. R. S. C.

A. "The long toll of the brave is not quenched in darkness nor hath counting the cost fretted away the zeal of their hopes. Over the fruitful earth and thwart the sun hath passed the light of noble deeds unquenchable forever."

Q. What is the usual salary of policemen in the larger American cities? H. L. E.

A. The starting salary of policemen in the nation's largest cities now averages \$2654 a year. The average maximum salary in 13 large cities is \$3210 a year. Los Angeles and San Francisco pay the highest salary to rookie policemen, while New York pays the highest maximum salary.
