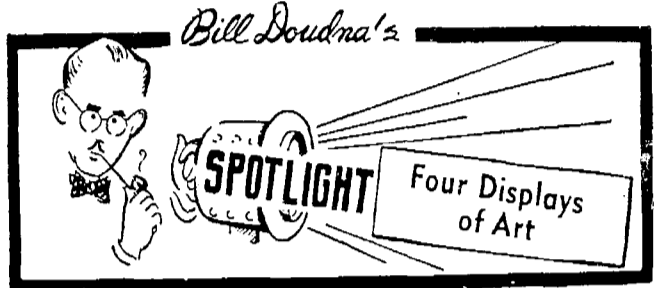


Play Time for Jane
