### At the Union

Sean O'Casey has used some stray wisps of humor left over from preceding scenes to intensify the last-act tragedy of his 'Juno and the Paycock' — a daring device but one that leaves the play poised gingerly on the edge of a cliff.

The Wisconsin Players, fortunately, have an acute sense of balance. They proved it Monday night.

Their production, while not entirely convincing, is workmanlike and skillful and includes several performances of real stature. Some of the characterizations at times are a little elaborate but the young actors and Geraldine Ryan, their director, succeeded well in preventing the play from bogging down in a morass of talk.

The story, mercifully, is not one of unadulterated Irish misery in spite of a situation that seems to guarantee it. 'Juno and the Paycock' is about a family living in a Dublin tenement in the early 1920s.

The father, ineffective and irresponsible, goes down at last with a sentimental malapropism on his lips; the daughter is educated beyond her station; the son has been hopelessly maimed in street fighting, and only the sturdy mother accepts the full burden of life. A freak bit of luck brings them a few months of security; then the final disaster comes in a few hours of mounting dismay.

Outstanding in the cast is Anita Jaffe as the mother. Her performance is sure and thoughtful and at times very touching. James Dorian plays the fumbling Boyle cleverly but makes him a bit more likeable than he should be. Gerald Hiken and Muriel Berkson have the showiest parts in the cast. 'Peacock' Boyle's drunken cry and his upstairs neighbor, and they play them to the hilt and perhaps a little past.

Others, all capable, are Richard Gill as the son, Eloise Liff, as the daughter, Arnold Waldman as the discarded sweetheart, and Jay Mayer as the school teacher turned lawyer. Eddythe Cohen has a tiny bit as a grieving mother and handles it quite beautifully.

Fredrick Buerki designed the single set that tells the whole background of the story with wonderful economy, but he really should fix the wilful door that persistently plagued the opening night's cast.

The play will be repeated at 8 every night through Saturday at the Wisconsin Union theater.
