**Hook, Line and Sinker**

Apparently many fishermen were under the impression that the special pike season in Wolf, Rock and Wisconsin river waters would open as soon as the spawning run got under way.  
It's an erroneous impression. The conservation commission does not order the season opened until biologists are satisfied that the pike have had a chance to spawn.  
After the fish leave the mud flats where they deposit their eggs and return to the river channel the anglers are given an opportunity to catch what they can before the pike go back to their lake homes.  
Dr. Edward Schneberger, chief of the fisheries division, says he explained this governing factor last week until he was "blue in the face."

Department biologists deemed a weekend opening inadvisable. Schneberger reported because of the obvious effect of the cold weather on spawning activity.  
The pike spawning run in the Rock river was observed fully a week ago, but the season opening in both the Rock and Wisconsin always waits until the Wolf is "ripe."  
Before the end of the week pike were reported well distributed over the marshes and mud flats on the Wolf below Shawand and Shiocton and conservation department hatchery crews took 87 quarts of eggs Thursday.  
On Friday they harvested 50 quarts of spawn and 700 fish in the nets represented a dropoff which Schneberger attributed to the cold weather.  
Madison area rough fish removal crews made two hauls of carp last week in the lower Dane county lakes.  
One test haul was made in the shallow water at the inlet of Lake Kegonsa to soak the nets preparatory to a bigger haul in Mud Lake, above Lake Waubesa.  
The Kegonsa haul, according to Lyle Dye, rough fish division superintendent, landed 6,000 pounds of carp and few game fish, which however, are not found in large numbers at this season in shallow water.  
But the Mud lake haul produced 90,000 pounds of carp and more than 20,000 white bass were found in the nets and released in addition to a few walleyes, a good number of bluegills and some northern, Dye said, but no black bass.  
Mild weather that preceded the weekend reversion to winter temperatures sent the waterfowl flying northward.  
Rupert Bois, North hall weatherman and duck hunting enthusiast, says he saw 38 swans in Columbia county one day last week, besides 3,000 to 5,000 geese on Mud lake, between Poynette and Rio.  
Many geese also were gathered, he reported, on the big marsh north of North Leeds.
