ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS

Q. Where was the first Marine base and when was it activated? L. R. D.
A. Marine Corps Headquarters says that the first station, or installation, of the Marine Corps was established in Philadelphia, Pa., in 1775. It was the headquarters of the Revolutionary Marines.
Q. When and by whom was the ice cream soda invented? C. R. S.
A. Robert M. Green of Philadelphia, a soda water manufacturer, is by some believed to have originated the ice cream soda in 1874 during the semi-centennial at the Franklin Institute. Another authority gives the credit to Fred Sanders of Detroit, who, on a hot day in 1875, substituted ice cream for sweet cream that had soured.
Q. Which are the largest Indian tribes? T. W. N.
A. The Navajos in northern Arizona and New Mexico are the largest Indian tribe in numbers and land ownership. Next come the Cherokees, who now live chiefly in Oklahoma.
Q. When was the first Lend-Lease aid given to the Soviet Union? E. McL.
A. The Lend-Lease Act was passed March 11, 1941. The first Lend-Lease aid to Russia was sent in December of that year.
Q. How large was the largest balloon ever constructed? J. J. A.
A. The largest balloon ever constructed was the Explorer II—192 feet in diameter. Most passenger balloons are from 30 to 80 feet in diameter. Explorer II was used by Stevens and Anderson to make their famous stratosphere flight in 1933, at which time they reached an altitude of 72,395 feet (almost 14 miles), the highest ever attained.
Q. Are the majority of homes in the United States now equipped with modern conveniences, such as electric light, refrigerators, etc.? B. W.
A. The last census revealed that 22 per cent of American dwellings had no electric power; 66 per cent had no mechanical refrigeration, and 58 per cent no central heating.

The opening lead of the jack of clubs was covered with the king from dummy, East won and cashed the queen of clubs.
